

Thoughts for Your Pennies...

Hey, penny pincher! Here are 10 fun things you can do with those spare pennies that are hanging out in the far reaches of your pockets...

- 1) Super-glue pennies to the bottoms of an old pair of shoes at the toes and heels...and then do a little tap dance!
- 2) Place a white piece of paper on top of a penny, and rub it with a lead pencil to make an impression of the coin's image.
- 3) Make a mosaic, using pennies and other coins, by gluing to old plates or pieces of wood. Stretch the imagination!
- 4) Trace a checkerboard or tic-tac-toe grid into the dirt or sand, and use pennies as game pieces. One player has heads, the other tails.
- 5) Challenge kids to a penny toss! Just set out empty containers, Hula-Hoops, or upside-down Frisbees as targets, and let the games begin.
- 6) *Invent your own scavenger hunt,* one that requires players to follow trails of pennies to get to clues.
- 7) Wire-wrap pennies, and use them on a hanging mobile project (see Nature's Hang-up in Chapter 1).
- 8) Decoupage-glue a tiny image cut from a magazine—anything that inspires!—to a penny, and save it as a token reminder of God's love.
- 9) Place some pennies at the bottom of a mason jar, and drop in a votive candle for a copper-accented glow.
- 10) Put on a talent show, and charge only penny admission!
